INNER SPACE EXHIBITION GUIDELINES

- The closing date for entry forms to be submitted is the 31st August 2024. Please email completed forms to Steve Rook: secretary@baba.org.uk
- Each piece of work should be thoughtfully designed and finished and explore/demonstrate the skills of the blacksmith.
- The work must fit within an imaginary cuboid measuring 400mm x 400mm x 1000mm. This is maximum size and it can be much smaller if you wish.
- The work must be completely stable and safe, and must be free-standing or able to be wall hung.
- You may submit up to three pieces.
- If work is not for sale please provide an insurance value.
- Your work should be delivered to British Artist Blacksmiths Association, Holme Lacy College, Holme Lacy Campus, Hereford HR2 6LL on Friday 20th September 2024, or on Saturday 21st between 8am and 12 noon.
- The work while on display at Holme Lacy Campus and in transit to Fire & Iron Gallery will be insured by BABA. At Fire & Iron Gallery work will be insured by Fire & Iron Gallery.
- The work shall be on display at Fire & Iron Gallery in Surrey as part of the **Mole Valley Arts Alive Festival** which runs through October 2024.
- BABA will cover all transport costs to Fire & Iron Gallery. The collection of the work from Fire & Iron will be the responsibility of the maker/owner of the work and you will be contacted by Fire & Iron Gallery regarding when work has to be uplifted
- Your work will need to be suitably packaged / protected and clearly marked with your name in re-packable packaging to take account of transport to Holme Lacy and to and from Fire & Iron Gallery.
- We would like each maker to provide a paragraph about themselves and their work, plus title and description of work. Lucy Quinnell of Fire & Iron Gallery can help with this if required. Lucy's email: lucy@fireandiron.co.uk
- Please be aware that during the Mole Valley Arts Alive Festival the sales commission to Fire & Iron will be 20% plus VAT (taken from your Retail Price) so please take that into account with your pricing. Fire & Iron normally takes a higher commission and this is a special low commission to give blacksmiths a stronger chance to sell their work during the Mole Valley Arts Alive Festival. If you work is sold at Fire & Iron Gallery, Lucy Quinnell will get in touch to obtain your bank details.
